SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS FOR

MX5 NSW HC22 R1 (Draft)

- 1. Authority: Event is held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices, the Motorsport Australia National Competition Rules (NCR) and the Speed Event Standing Regulations, the Motorsport Australia Motor Sport Passengers Ride Activity Policy, This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with any and all necessary Motorsport Australia COVID-19 Return to Race strategy requirements, the Motorsport Australia Return to Race Strategy, these Supplementary Regulations, and any Further Regulations issued by the organising club. This Event will be conducted under and in accordance which can be found on the Motorsport Australia WH&S, Motorsport Australia Safety 1st and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au.
- 2. The organiser reserves the right to refuse any entry in accordance with NCR 83 and to cancel the meeting if, in its opinion, insufficient entries are received. The organiser reserves the right to cancel, postpone or abandon the event in accordance with NCR 59.

Protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport.

- 3. Motorsport Australia Permit No: TBA. Permit will be displayed at the Event, in the Event Admin building.
- 4. Organising Club: Mazda MX-5 Club of NSW Inc
- Type of Event: Hillclimb. Minimum of 5 official runs of Ringwood Park tracks A2 and A6. See layouts on Page 4.
 Further official runs may be announced prior to the beginning of the final official run.
- 6. Date: 19th Jube 2022 Day: Sunday.
- Venue: Ringwood Park Hillclimb Location: Italia Rd, Balickera (North of Newcastle)

10. Eligible Vehicles: Only Mazda MX5's will be eligible for prizes; any car is eligible for entry.

11. Prizes and Trophies: A prize will be awarded for 1st, place in each class at the yearly MX-5 Club motorsport presentation.

12. Classes: To be ascertained at Scrutineering.

- 1. Standard MX5 under 1840cc on 180 tread wear or higher tyres, no wider than 205mm width.
- 2. Standard MX5 under 2000cc on 180 tread wear or higher tyres, no wider than 215mm width.
- 3. Modified MX5 under 1840cc on 180 tread wear or higher tyres, no wider than 205mm width.
- 4. Modified MX5 under 2000cc on 180 tread wear or higher tyres, no wider than 215mm width.
- 5. Any MX5 over 2000cc and any MX5 with tyres outside Class 1, 2, 3 or 4 rules.
- 6. Any other car.

13. Entries.

- a. Maximum number of Driver Entries: **35**; Reserves: **5**
- **b.** Maximum number of Drivers per vehicle: **2**. Dual entry acceptance will be at the discretion of the club.
- c. Opening Date: On acceptance of these Supplementary Regulations.
- d. Closing Date: 11:59pm Sunday, 12th June 2022. No entries will be accepted after this date!
- e. Entry fees:
 - MX5 Club member: \$90

Non-members: \$100 which includes 1day membership to MX5 Club of NSW

- f. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt and must be submitted via <u>Motorsport Australia Event Entry</u>. Credit/Debit Card payments will NOT incur a surcharge.
- g. Email confirming acceptance of entries will be sent to each competitor (No later than Wednesday 15st June 2022).
- **h.** If a Competitor advises the Event Organiser that he/she is unable to attend the event, the following procedure regarding a refund applies: **at the Organiser's discretion.**
 - **NOTE:** No refund will be considered after the closing date.
- i. Any vehicle presented for Scrutiny will for the purpose of the entry be deemed to have competed.
- j. Competition numbers will be issued on the day.
- **14. Minimum Licences:** Current Motorsport Australia **Speed**, **Junior Speed** or a Motorsport Australia Licence of a higher status. A current Club Membership card of the MX-5 Car Club of NSW must be presented to receive the club member entry price.

15. Drivers Safety.

a. All Drivers and Passengers shall wear apparel including helmets which comply with Schedule D of the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport. Helmets must be in good condition with no visual signs of damage.

For a Driver of an open car, a full-face helmet is highly recommended. Goggles or a visor with a lens material other than glass (i.e. to AS1609- 1981) are mandatory.

An open car is defined by Motorsport Australia as: "An automobile without a supporting structure between the tops of the windscreen pillars and those of the rear window (if fitted)." which means unless your MX5 has a hardtop which is permanently attached, or requires tools to remove, this rule applies to you.

- **b.** The use of Frontal Head Restraint is not mandatory however an FIA approved device is recommended.
- c. Non-flammable Clothing must be worn that extends from ankles to neck to wrist. Clothing of flammable synthetic material such as nylon is not acceptable. Overalls of an approved standard detailed in Schedule D Article 3.3 in the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport are recommended. The onus will be on the competitor to prove that older overalls/suits still have fire-resistant properties and are not impregnated with oil or fuel.
- **d.** Flame retardant underwear and socks are not mandatory however FIA standard flame-retardant underwear and socks are recommended. A Flame-retardant balaclava is not mandatory; however, a motor sport standard flame retardant balaclava is recommended.
- e. Shoes compliant with FIA8856-2000 or shoes which completely cover the feet, made entirely of leather or other flameresistant material must be worn. Shoes which have a leather upper but which includes elasticised ankle regions are acceptable. Shoes that contain any synthetic materials such as nylon are not acceptable.
- f. Gloves are not mandatory, however the use of FIA- standard flame-retardant gloves are strongly recommended.
- g. For all MX5's, the MX5 Club strongly recommends to competitors, for their own safety, that a roll over protection to comply with Motorsport Australia safety cage structures, be installed.

14. Scrutiny Requirements:

- All vehicles are to be presented at scrutiny with a Motorsport Australia Log Book (if issued) and must comply with Schedules
 A & B of the current Motorsport Australia General Requirements for Automobiles (as specific in the current Motorsport
 Australia Manual of Motor Sport), including the items listed below.
 - 1. A fire extinguisher to Motorsport Australia requirements and fitted within reach of the driver. Refer Schedule H of the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport.
 - 2. A blue triangle, 150mm on each side mounted to indicate the battery location. Refer Schedule B Article 16 in the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport.
 - **3.** A secondary method of securing the bonnet. Refer Schedule B Article 1 in the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport.
 - **Note:** Road Registered cars fitted with the original manufacturers 2 stage bonnet locking system is considered as having two securing systems.
 - 4. All loose objects are to be removed from the car.
 - 5. The battery is to be firmly clamped.
- **b.** Drivers and vehicles must be presented in a clean and tidy manner, completely ready for the track including the Driver's apparel and helmet. Any tyre or component changes to the vehicle after scrutiny must be approved by the Chief Scrutineer before the vehicle is taken onto the track.
- c. Any vehicle found to be leaking oil or fluids whilst competing will be suspended from the event until the Chief Scrutineer / Clerk of the Course is satisfied that action has been taken to rectify the leak. Should there be a re-occurrence of the leak then the vehicle will be disqualified from the remainder of the event.
- d. As per Article 18 of Schedule B of the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport, all vehicles must be fitted with a visible towing point (capable of accepting a 40mm OD cylindrical test object) fitted forward of the front axle and rearward of the rear axle and capable of towing the automobile on a sealed surface with its wheels locked. Where a tow point is obscured, each tow point shall be marked with the word "TOW" of a contrasting colour marking the location of each tow point. A road registered series production automobile fitted with any unmodified original equipment tow point shall be exempt from these requirements, save for the requirement to identify an obscured tow point;
- e. Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport.
- f. All video cameras, data loggers & other electronic devices must be securely fixed to the vehicle in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Where suction cups are used a secondary tether sufficiently strong enough to prevent the item moving within the vehicle should the suction cup/s release must be used.

NOTE: Event Organisers reserve the right to impound the camera in the event of a Critical Incident

If the entrant wishes to compete in wet weather, windscreen wipers, headlights, and tail lights need to be operational. A sticker will be issued confirming that the vehicle has passed scrutiny prior to it being able to compete.

15. Noise: Maximum Noise Limit: 95 dba at 30 metres. Any car found to exceed the maximum noise emission limit will be suspended from the event until the Chief Scrutineer / Clerk of the Course is satisfied that action has been taken to bring it within the limit. Any vehicle that exceeds the limit on two runs will be excluded from the remainder of the event. If a vehicle exceeds the noise limit on any lap or laps within a run then only those laps in which the vehicle conformed to the requirements will be allowed for the purpose of the results.

16. Drivers' Briefing:

It is compulsory for ALL Drivers to attend. Scrutineering will cease whilst the Drivers' Briefing is in progress;

Time: 8:30 am; Location: Outside Event Admin building

a. NOTE: A Driver sign-on sheet must be completed by all Drivers to prove Briefing attendance, failure to sign on may result in penalties being applied by the Stewards of the Meeting. The Organising Club must retain these sheets for any incident or accident reporting.

- **18. Replacement Vehicles.** At the sole discretion of the Clerk of the Course, a Driver whose vehicle has broken down may use a replacement vehicle. The replacement vehicle must have been scrutinised.
- 19. Results: Times can be viewed outside the administration building and will be published on the club's website.
- **20.** Authority of Officials. Any Driver not following a reasonable instruction by an official during the Event may be disqualified at the discretion of the Steward of the Meeting.
- 21. Medical Facilities: St John's Ambulance officer and onsite equipment.
- 22. Crash Rescue and Fire Fighting Facilities: As per Track Licence.
- 23. Protests. Any protests must be made in accordance with Part XII of the NCR's.
- 24. Postponement/Abandonment/Cancellation. The Organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the Event is accordance with the NCR 59 of the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport.
- 25. Alcohol, Drugs and other Substances: Any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the Motorsport Australia website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.
- 26. Refreshment/Lunch Facilities available: In the canteen near the start line. Kindly provided (at your cost) by volunteers from the MG Car Club of Newcastle.
- 27. Additions and/or Alterations: Any additions and/or alterations to these Supplementary Regulations will be notified to all Drivers in the Final Regulations or during the Drivers' Briefing.
- **28. STARTING ORDER:** As listed on Running Order which will be emailed to each entrant, and will be available outside the Event Admin building.

NOTE: It is each entrant's responsibility to ensure they line up in the correct order to avoid missing a run.

29. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

- a. Competition vehicles to travel at walking pace in Paddock Pit Area & Spectator areas.
- **b.** RED light or FLAG = **STOP**.
- c. Drivers will receive a signal from the starter after staging at the Start Line, and should start as soon as possible.
- d. Drivers MUST brake immediately after the front wheel has crossed the Finish Line at Corner 8.
- e. Drivers must comply to the traffic flow as indicated within the Pit / Paddock Areas.
- f. Drivers must STOP in the return to PITS bay prior to turning right to the paddock area.
